Brain Injury Awareness Beanie

Robyn Lawler writes: The ladies of **Tatters and Chatters** were asked by the Lifestyle Co-Coordinator at Lota House if we would like to be involved with making woollen squares for Brain Injury Awareness.

A group of us made 30 squares (20cm x 20cm) in multiple colours and patterns. I contacted Belinda Adams, the organizer of the event, about making them. I told her who we were and she was delighted about the Contribution. Belinda asked if we could send them in a sewn together pattern 3 squares by 10 squares due to the amount of squares they had received. Eventually, the beanie will be disassembled into blankets for charity.





My son Seb and I went to the event on the Sunday the 25th of August at Captain Burke Park, which is under the Story Bridge. We were there to see Belinda and her crew raise the beanie as per the photos to raise Awareness of Brain Injuries during Brain Injury Awareness week. Belinda Adams organized the event as her 30 year old son has a brain injury and due to their struggle to find support she decided to do this event.



Traumatic Brain Injury remains a global public issue and is a major source of death and disability world wide. In Australia 1 in every 45 people suffer some form of brain injury which limits their activities and impacts their life. Brain Injury victims struggle to find Resources and support. The event was organized with the help of the Hopkins Centre and the Brain Injury Community.



We would thoroughly recommend others joining in Ekka Day next year. It was a great morning.













