Another year completed of our annual event in honour of the consecration of the land and remembering our Pioneers. 156 years since the beginning and many more to come. The committee and I personally thank you and all that you do on and off the grounds. Without your support our gates would close and the history would be lost for the next generations.

We had over 58 attendees join the working bee and music event. We raised over \$700 which goes to the upkeep of the property. We now have 429

members on Facebook, over 120 members joined our group and over 40 graves have been adopted for care and respect. Every action we do moves us in a stronger position of longevity.

## **Community Matters**

#### The Cursillo Crew Creating Community

Nick Crisp writes: The Manly Parish Cursillistas gathered for their monthly Group Reunion on Saturday 12, at the home of Marj Harrington. Before midday-ish, some of us departed to represent Manly Cursillistas at an Ultreya ("Reunion of Groups") hosted by Freshwater Parish (Deception Bay) with



help from Redcliffe Parish. We also delivered a small collection of past banners to Freshwater, to add colour to the church, and also remind everyone just how big this Movement is here in Southern Queensland. Prior to each Weekend, the Team prepares a themed banner – usually embroidered, sometime printed.

Within the Diocese of Southern Queensland there is much Cursillo activity, led by a Secretariat team (currently 9 lay-people, plus Rev'd Pauline Harley and Bp. Cameron Venables) and a Servant Community team (currently 6 lay-people). Growing the movement is our focus, both locally and nationally, with much planning (meetings in-person and on-line) for the next DSQ Cursillo Weekend (the starting-point of all Cursillo journeys) in August (22-24) 2025 at Glendalough (Sunshine Coast). The Lay Director for the 2025 Weekend (dubbed W/M83) is Ann Martin Victor of Waterloo Bay Parish. Ann will be commissioned by Bp. Cam at the Diocesan Ultreya at Sherwood on November 2. Jennifer is on Ann's Team as Proctor. The Team will be commissioned at a dedicated Service, next March or April.

There is a meeting of the National Secretariat in Newcastle later this month (25-27) and DSQ will be well represented. Just to the south of us, there has been a Weekend (W/M63) held at Grafton Cathedral over the last three days. We eagerly await reports from the Team there, as we wish to copy much from the format they have used, for our W/M83.

#### The Vicar's Voice



My heart sings at the amazing blush of purple as the Jacarandas do their thing with gusto. I'm also aware that it signals end of year assessments for our senior students which can be a time for added stress and special care for those with a teenager in the home.

A big highlight for me was to attend Decorating Day at the Tingalpa Pioneer Chapel and Cemetery. There was a glorious buzz of activity around the site with people pushing wheelbarrows of dirt, poking about crevices to remove hard to get at weeds, things being tidied and mulched and generally spruced up. I was pleased to bump into Fr Sam from St Peter's who was there to lead a committal of ashes with a local family and to chat with Beryl and Jan from his flock too. I had a great catch up with the ladies from the Tingalpa Uniting Church running a craft and gift stall. I know their pastor Rev Dan Skippen from when I worked with his wife Rev Bea at Bulimba. It was good to make connections with our friends in Christ at the western end of the parish. Seeds for shared ministry are already being sown.

President of the friends committee Ray Pini was pleased to share with us some of the plans for future development including grants for painting the chapel and to continue developing their memorial gardens. The committee works so hard on maintaining the legacy of the Anglican Church at Christ Church and I look forward to how we can continue to maintain and grow our connection in that place.

Speaking of Memorial Gardens. It was good to be able to share some of the progress on plans for the developments around Lota House last week including the erection of safety fencing that will change access to a large part of the property for some time. This does effect the St Paul's Memorial Garden. It has definitely not been forgotten about or deliberately delayed but we have had to pause due to the uncertainty of the scope of the development. Much of the area that might be appropriate for a Memorial Garden will be in construction zones. The delay is about protecting the precious memorial objects from disturbance during the construction phase that is much bigger than many anticipated. Parish Council relies on the working group from the development company and Anglicare to give advice and will share progress as the development unfolds. In the meantime, we will provide safe and respectful storage for the precious items. Thank you for your patience and please ask me if you have any questions or concerns.
