While its usually all about the blokes, the group regularly invites partners and friends to join them for a slap up feed while supporting a local business.

Nick and Chris from St Paul's are regulars in the group but it was an excellent opportunity for Fr Andrew to meet folk and drag Mark Austin along for moral support.... we think an unsupervised Thai meal which involved rarely allowed curry puffs was part of the appeal for Mark. Healthy appetites meant food didn't stay getting cold on the plates too long!!

We appreciated the efforts of the warm and efficient staff in providing us with tasty delights and kept us hydrated while introductions, chats, catch ups and connections were made. Nick shared an engaging passage from their latest study book "Heaven All Around Us" that emphasised the sacredness of meals and table fellowship. There are plans afoot for the next Advent themed focus book... always a good start to bounce thoughts, questions and experiences.

It was great to hear about men sharing the ups and downs of life and to meet some of the amazing partners that share all that too. An inspiring gathering of folk from different churches and different life experiences all about supporting each other in a bloke friendly space.

# **Community Matters**

# Men's Fellowship Group Who we are, what we do, why men should be there.

The "Wynnum Men's Fellowship Group" in its current iteration, started at the prompting of Rev'd Greg March, sometime in 2012. We are not all from St Peter's, Wynnum. In fact, we are not even all Anglican. We are welcoming though, trying to be Christians, and thus reliable, thoughtful, trustworthy, helpful, and of course, humble! (OK, sometimes we have clergy among us too!)

We meet at St Peter's (Bride St. Wynnum), usually in the hall, but sometimes in the chapel, (nearly) every Wednesday, from ~7:30pm 'til ~9pm. Our "convenor", Charles Dunbar, emails and texts us reminders, especially if there is a change to plans. We start the evening with a quick (or sometimes, not-so-quick) whiparound as to how we have fared since last week. We are a small group — usually there are between five and eight of us, so there is plenty of time for sharing, and plenty of time for just listening. We are all involved with church and life things outside the group, so the make-up of the group varies a lot. When we are ready to move on to a "study session", we begin with a group prayer.

Currently we are working our way through the book "Heaven All Around Us" by Simon Carey Holt. Previously we examined the devotional book "Solo" – recommended to us by the late Fr. Bill Armstrong. Sometimes we skip along fast. Other times, we find some of us need lots of time to pick apart a particular section. Sometimes just one sentence can consume us for quite a while. Some weeks we come back to something from a previous week, as we have found new things to put to the group.

We are there for our health! It is great to have mates we can lean-on in stressful times. It is great to realise nothing new happens to us — someone else in the group has always "been there, done that" with wonderful advice. It is great to grow our knowledge of God and His plans for us, by listening to other's wisdom. It is great to debate the worth of an author's opinions, as what is written has usually been well considered before it makes it to the publisher! It is great to find commentary that helps us make sense of our own experiences.

It is also great to "break bread together". Every month that has five Wednesdays, we put the book discussion on hold, and instead meet at a restaurant somewhere nearby, for a meal together. On October 23 we had dinner at Absolute Thai in Wynnum. There are no constraints (not gender, or any other kind) on who may join us for dinner. We just need to know the numbers a few days prior, for booking seating capacity.

## The Vicar's Voice

### We want our feast back!!!

You can't help but notice the growing presence of ghoulish decorations, folk preparing scary costumes for the kids (and themselves) and the growing number of Halloween events advertised around the place. You may be embracing it all with joy and stocking up on the sugar gifts that keep on giving to parents everywhere... you might be a bit grumpy, raising a scornful eyebrow at the unAustralian consumer opportunities... or deeply concerned at what seems an unchristian invitation to invite evil into our lives.... or variations on those themes.

Personally I think we need to reclaim our place in the conversation as we approach All Hallow's Evening... the night before All Saints Day.

Halloween is actually a deeply Christian festival that is not about death and dying but about life... the defeat of death and suffering. It is our day to proclaim the scriptures! To shout the resurrection promise... our own St Paul says "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" (1 Corinthians 15:55)

regards to all her friends here. As usual, we discussed politics, various social issues and life in general.






# Caring is What We Do


# Our Carer Program provides a range of services to assist Adult Carers in their caring role.

We understand the caring role. That's why we offer a range of FREE services for unpaid family and friend carers to support the amazing role that carers play in the community.

## Our services include:







- No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS) providing access to interest-free loans for the purchase of essential goods and services up to the value of \$2000 for eligible carers.
- Community Engagement increasing the awareness of unpaid family and friend carers through tailored information sessions and attending community events.
- Carer Representative Program ensuring that carers lived experiences and perspectives are represented in policy development, service planning and media.
- Carer Gateway Liaison working in collaboration with Carer Gateway provider Wellways to increase the awareness of carers by co-facilitating events and referring carers for support.
