MU 16 Days of Activism Campaign

25 November 2024 is the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women and marks day one of the 16 Days of Activism.

Each year, from 25 November to 10 December, World Human Rights Day, the 16 Days of Activism campaign calls for action against one of the world's most persistent violations of human rights - violence against women.

The international campaign was started by the Women's Global Leadership Institute in 1991. It begins each year on the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women and runs until Human Rights Day. For the past few years, the theme for the campaign has focused on 'ending femicide' and this year's global theme is "UNITE! Invest to prevent violence against women and girls".

During the 16 Days of Activism, people around the world unite to raise awareness about gender-based

violence, challenge discriminatory attitudes and call for improved laws and services to end violence against women for good.

Throughout this campaign, MU Australia joins over 6000 organisations from over 185 countries to raise awareness of and call for an end to gender based violence and abuse in all forms and in all societies.

Gender based violence is one of the most widespread violations of human rights. It can affect anyone at any time and it takes many forms. It can be part of a damaging cultural norm or hidden behind closed doors. But we believe that we must bring this out into the light.

MU groups work in partnership with local domestic abuse organisations and parishes to raise awareness about the prevalence of all forms of abuse in our communities and give practical examples of how we can all be part of the change.

MU Manly-Wynnum Branch have prepared a booklet of prayers and reflections to focus our thinking and hold this important issue before our God. We are also busy working with our partners at St Peter's Wynnum preparing to launch our Red Bench project... The presence of a Red Bench in a public location aims to raise awareness of domestic violence and provide an opportunity for this important issue to remain visible. We will be sharing more of this very soon!
