Have you seen our Advent Giving Tree?

The focus this year is personal care packs to be given to clients attending Pete's Pantry. Fr Andrew recorded a short interview with Pantry Coordinator Marilyn Jacobs to introduce our Advent Giving focus. Marilyn explained how the services provided at Pete's Pantry has grown from a small group sharing a simple bowl of cereal to a service hub serving dozens of people each Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

We all were disturbed by the rapid growth in need in the Bayside as the numbers of people experiencing homelessness or struggling to make ends has expanded way beyond what anyone would have expected. Our Giving Tree appeal is aimed at providing basic personal hygiene care packs. St Paul's folk generously responded by taking a tag of the Giving Tree with suggestions for an age and gender appropriate Wash Bag. These are already piling up under the tree as folk bring them or a donation back.

We are also grateful for the consideration of the team at the Church of The Nazarene who provide the space, advertising and entertainment. Another community partnership that does not shout our Christian message aggressively but in a spirit of welcome, hospitality and inclusion. The fundraising is so important for our mission but the conversations, connections and presence speaks volumes too.


