# Community Matters MU draws community together to give the vulnerable a Voice





Mothers Union Manly Wynnum Branch draws the year to a close with a big effort to raise awareness of the impact of family and gender based violence with participation in the world wide 16 Days of Activism we wrote about in this newsletter last week.

While small locally our MU voice is mighty when joined with so many other organisations worldwide to speak out against the awful statistics around gender based violence. President Ailsa Gill represented our local ladies at the launch service for our diocesan involvement last Monday at St John's Cathedral and it was so important to see us take our place in a strong public way. We are also sharing a daily reflection point on our parish Facebook page and have material available for anyone who would like a printed copy.

On Tuesday we gathered for the last monthly MU Eucharist and meeting for the year. Fr Andrew took elements from the MU 16 Day of Activism resources including a selection of powerful scripture passages, a gospel expansion and special prayers written by women from around the world.

After the compulsory cuppa, Fr Andrew led the ladies, ably assisted by warden Rob Wilson on Tech, in a conversation titled Dealing with the Big Things in the World. It was heartening to see how engaged our ladies are in things beyond our small community but also to consider how we manage when it all just get too overwhelming. This beautiful quote from the Talmud below formed part of our thinking about helping manage our feelings when things seem so hard.


