On Tuesday the 4th of February, in the much lamented absence of the president, Manly Wynnum Mother's Union Vice President Bev Schmidt, aided by Treasurer Secretary Robyn Lawlor, chaired the first official gathering for 2025 as they plotted world dominion and the activities for the year ahead. In her defence, President Ailsa Gill was called to higher duties at the Diocesan Executive Meeting at St Francis College Milton, exercising her power and authority as Co-Deanery President with Kay Voltz.

Ailsa reports that the Executive also made plans for the year's activities including Lady Day at the Cathedral on Wednesday 26th March and

the Annual General Meeting on 11th March at Ipswich with the Archbishop presiding and a presentation from representatives from "Hope in a Suitcase"... a service for children in foster care.

There was wise discussion about the challenges of gathering at Lota House during the construction and the decision has been made to have the monthly service in the airconditioned comfort of St Peter's Wynnum for the next 6 months. This will be reviewed as the development progresses. The ladies are grateful to Fr Sam and the Wynnum members for getting this in motion.

Fr Andrew encouraged members to look for ways to collaborate and form partnerships to continue to tell the story of MU and to live into the core aim to advocate for support of family life and particularly women and children.

The workshop considering Elder Abuse in 2024 was a great



example and thoughts are already in happening to see what might be possible in 2025. There are lots of lovely thoughts about participating in events and projects with the residents of E M Tooth and of course strengthening the bonds between our parishes across the diocese.

There was a great energy with the members and a lovely spirit of optimism and hope while being realistic about how to best use the gifts and talents at this stage of life. We look forward a busy but productive year ahead. Thank you to all for your wise contributions and wisdom.
